Why study *Religious Studies*?

Religious Studies is the study of the phenomenon of religious ideas and how people across the world seek God and meaning in their lives. In addressing the fundamental questions of life as well as religious experience, ethics and practice, the subject is wonderfully wide-ranging and challenging.

Although the study of religion is worthwhile in its own right, the skills it teaches equip students for many degrees particularly in Law and Medicine and Philosophy and Religious Studies.

The Course

The course is made up of four modules – two taken in each year.

Year 12 AS

Module 1 –AS Philosophy of Religion: Ancient Greek influences and Judaeo-Christian influences on Philosophy of Religion, Traditional Arguments for the Existence of God and Challenges to Religious Belief (External Assessment)

Module 2 –AS Religious Ethics: Ethical theories and applied ethics topics (External Assessment)

Year 13 A2

Module 3 –A2 Philosophy of Religion: Religious language, Experience and Religion, The Nature of God, Life after Death and Miracle (External Assessment)

Module 4 –A2 Religious Ethics: Meta-ethics, Free will and Determinism, Conscience, Virtue ethics and applied ethics topics (External Assessment)
